Environment – We are committed to protecting the environment. We work with national and local organizations to conserve important habitats, protect species at risk and educate individuals about the importance of the environment.

Responding to Local Needs

We understand that the needs and priorities of a community are best determined by the people who live and work within it.

Regional staff – who live and work in the communities along our pipeline systems across North America – play an important role in our community investment work. These men and women engage with communities to develop initiatives that are tailored to support local needs.

Energy East in 2014

Last year, Energy East invested over \$550,000 in local, non-profit organizations in initiatives that helped enhance well-being, protect the environment and promote safety in communities along the proposed pipeline route. Here are just a few of the key initiatives we supported:

- Donated funds to help re-establish the habitats of endangered species in a provincially significant wetland area in Ontario.
- Supported 15 safety initiatives to ensure that communities could help prevent and appropriately respond to emergency situations.
- Provided a donation to purchase an all-terrain response vehicle so that an isolated fire department can now respond to emergencies in remote locations.
- Funded an automated external defibrillator (AED) training program in seven Ontario high schools that teaches young people how to save lives.
- Supported an affordable childcare initiative that will help make childcare more accessible to young parents, ensuring that they can continue raising their children in their hometown.
