

# Construction Camps

During the construction phase of the Energy East Pipeline Project, construction camps will be built at locations along the pipeline route to temporarily house construction and management personnel.

For pipeline construction projects where the pipeline passes through remote areas, or the anticipated personnel demand is expected to exceed availability of local accommodations, construction camps are required. These camps will house workers close to work sites, minimizing their commuting distance.

A typical camp will consist of a gravel-surfaced yard containing buildings used for:

- Accommodations and offices
- Parking stalls
- Site-servicing systems such as: power, communications, water, waste water

## Camp Size, Location and Selection

Construction camp site selection involves assessing the best locations that will minimize impact on the natural environment and local communities. Preference is usually given to sites already served by an existing access road. In some cases, construction camps may require building new temporary access roads.

Planning for the selection, location and size of camps will be determined during detailed engineering in conjunction with feedback from relevant local stakeholder and Indigenous groups.

Camps can span up to five hectares. The duration of camp operations, number of workers required during peak construction periods, type of work being performed, as well as the availability of local accommodations, are factors that will determine the size of the camp.

## Construction Camps Benefit Communities

Benefits of construction camps include local employment in the form of camp operations, catering, housekeeping, maintenance and service jobs for local residents. Temporary construction workers will also generate increased demand for goods and services, stimulating local economic activity.

TransCanada is fully committed to working with communities where construction camps are anticipated. We engage with the relevant stakeholders to address their concerns and mitigate any potentially adverse impacts to ensure mutually beneficial outcomes.

## Campsite Operations

The largest element of campsite operations will be catering and housekeeping for the residents. Other activities will include:

- Maintenance operations of the camp
- Restocking of fuel and supplies by truck
- Daily transport of personnel between the camp, muster areas and worksites by multi-passenger vehicles

Security plans for construction camps will be developed to address company policies, the health and safety of personnel, and the security of equipment and material. Camps will be equipped with medical facilities and personnel to handle medical problems, should they arise.
